Jesus often taught using parables—simple stories that conveyed deep spiritual truths. These stories helped Him connect with everyday people, using relatable situations like farming, family, or business dealings. Parables made His teachings more accessible, especially to mixed crowds that included both the doubters and the curious. These stories allowed Jesus to reveal truth to those genuinely seeking, while also concealing deeper meaning from those unwilling to listen with an open heart.

Before you read each parable, pray that you might hear the words of Jesus with an open heart and that the truth of His words will become a part of your journey to grow deep in Him.
